COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY CITY OF LONDON ORDINANCE NO. 2024-04

AN ORDINANCE MAKING MOUNTAIN LIFE MUSEUM ROAD IN THE LEVI JACKSON CITY PARK A ONE WAY ROAD WITH A WALKING LANE

The Levi Jackson Park was conveyed by deed from the Commonwealth of Kentucky to the City of London in 2019. Prior to that time, the City of London annexed all of the property previously owned by the Commonwealth known as the Levi Jackson State Park. All of this property is now owned by the City of London and is now a City Park ("Park").

Be it Ordained as follows:

There is a paved two-lane road within the Park known as "Mountain Life Museum Road" ("Museum Road") from approximately the McHargue Mill to and to the intersection with the Levi Jackson Fariston Road (another paved road that is designated as a service road). For the Benefit of campers and others using the Park and the need for a surfaced walking track type area in that scenic area of the Park is evident by the number of people already using the Road as a walking area. For such reasons:

- The north side (or McHargue Mill side) of Museum Road (beginning at McHargue Mill) shall be for pedestrian and cyclist use and not for automobiles.
- 2. The opposite side shall be one-way for automobile traffic from McHargue Mill to the intersection of Jackson Fariston Road.
- 3. The center of the roadway will have dividers separating pedestrian traffic from automobile traffic.
- 4. Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall be effective on publication.
